Valerie narrated and appeared in the critically acclaimed documentary on the dangers of nuclear proliferation, *Countdown to Zero* and is an active member of the Global Zero Leadership board. Valerie has done extensive public speaking throughout the country and internationally on issues including nuclear proliferation, women in intelligence, and the NSA revelations. She has written for *Newsweek, CNN, The Daily Beast, The Huffington Post,* as well as *The Guardian*. Valerie is a consultant to Warner Brothers TV and serves as Director of Community Outreach at the Santa Fe Institute, a nonprofit research think tank dedicated to multidisciplinary collaboration in the sciences. She serves on the boards of United Way of Santa Fe County, the Penn State School of International Affairs, Postpartum Support International, and is involved in local public school reform.
