I can't think of anything else to say so I guess since the holidays are around the corner, I'll put in my famous rum cake recipe here. It is foolproof, I promise.

Lina's Rum Cake

Ingredients

1 cup chopped nuts, optional (I use pecans)

1 box yellow cake mix (check box for adjustment if needed for high altitude)

1 small package instant French Vanilla pudding (3.4 oz)

4 eggs

1/2 cup cold water

1/2 cup Vegetable Oil

1/2 cup Rum (80 proof)

Preparation

Heat oven at 325°. Grease and flour 10" tube or Bundt cake pan. Scatter nuts on bottom.

Mix cake batter. Pour in pan, bake for 1 hour at 325°.

<u>Cool,</u> invert pan. Drizzle glaze (see below) over the cake.

Glaze:

4 Tbsp. Butter

2 Tbsp. Water

- 1/2 cup powdered sugar
- 4 Tbsp. Rum (80 proof)

Melt butter. Add water and sugar. Stir over medium heat and let boil for 5 minutes or so, stirring constantly, until it thickens. Remove from heat, add rum and pour immediately on cake.
