The Capitol Art Collection The State Capitol Complex also houses a major public, permanent collection of contemporary art by artists who live and work in the state. There are over 500 masterworks in the Capitol Art Collection, which is valued at 5.5 million dollars and continues to grow each year. The collection is overseen by the Capitol Art Foundation, which consists of a board of directors representing New Mexico's geographic regions. A diverse range of media, styles, and traditions are represented, including painting, sculpture, works on paper, mixed media, ceramic, collage, textiles, Spanish Colonial art, and handcrafted furniture. In addition to the permanent Collection, the Capitol Art Foundation also manages the temporary changing exhibitions in the Rotunda Gallery.

AAUW- Santa Fe STEM Programs

Not enough women have careers in STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math). Women make up a disappointing 12 percent of working engineers and account for just 26 percent of computing professionals — a substantially smaller portion than 30 years ago and about the same percentage as in 1960.

AAUW is helping girls across the country break through the barriers that stand in their way, so that they can pursue satisfying, exciting, and rewarding careers in high-paying STEM fields that have been so disproportionately dominated by men.

We must give every girl who has ever dreamed of becoming an astronaut, computer scientist, engineer, industrial designer, or mathematician the chance to fulfill her goals. And that's what we are doing through our STEM programs, AAUW National Tech Savvy and Tech Trek!

The Santa Fe Branch of AAUW now has 98 paid members and 6 Lifetime members for the 2015 - 2016 year.

Directions to the AAUW-Santa Fe Online Directory and Other Password Protected Branch Information

- A (1)Enter AAUW-Santa Fe in Google. (2) Click on AAUW-Santa Fe to reach the branch homepage. (3) Find "About Us" on the top left of the branch home page. (4) Place the cursor over "About Us" and a list will appear. (5) Move the cursor down the list to "Membership". (6) "Santa Fe Member Center" will appear to the right of "Membership". Click on it. (7) The Password box will appear. Fill in the password** and click on "submit".
- B Once you click on submit, you will see "Protected: Santa Fe Member Center" and a list. The last item on the list is the Directory, Click on it.
