Legislative Activity

Once again, we are entering the New Mexico State legislative cycle, preparing for the one-month Legislative Session that will run from January 16 to February 15, 2018. Although during the one-month sessions the primary focus is generally upon the budget, many other matters have been suggested for possible legislative action, so the session promises to be not only quick but jam-packed. One area sure to be addressed is policy on Harassment in the Government: debate on this and other vital timely topics will be fascinating to watch.

2018 New Mexico Legislative Dates

December 15, 2017 - January 12 Legislation may be pre-filed

- January 16 Opening day (noon)
- January 31 Deadline for introduction of new bills
- February 15 Session ends (noon)
- March 7 Legislation not acted upon by governor is pocket vetoed
- May 16 Effective date of legislation not a general appropriation bill or a bill carrying an emergency clause or other specified date

Our Lobby Corps consists of members who become knowledgeable on one or more specific AAUW-NM priorities, read bills, attend committee meetings, and lobby their New Mexico legislators.
